

Dr. Piero Antuono graduated from the inversity of Florence Medical Schol and after additional training in Neurology and Neuropsychiatry he joined the MCW faculty where he developed a comprehensive program for the dementias from basic research to clinics drug studies and a brain bank. He was Medical Director of the Nun Sidy, looking at risk factors for Alzheimer's disease and has expeveloped at MCW new fMRI techniques for the preclinical diagnosis of Alzheimer's disease. He is known internationally. Recently he has dedicated himself to the development of a community rollic for Latinos with dementia at United Community Center (UCC) in Milwaukee. With his staff, he developed a mobile memory loss clinic addressing the unmet needs of this population with culturally specific educational programs. In collaboration with the UCC, UMilwaukee, and the Alzheimer's Association, the clinic received funding from the Wisconsin Department of Health Services and UVMadison.
